

WHHA Annual Meeting  
November 12, 2013

The meeting began at 7:02 pm. Board members present included Freda, Annelise, Greg, Paul, and Jordan. There were 22 households represented.

The first order of business was to discuss the new sign (no cost out of pocket) and park improvements.

Next, we discussed the sign at 89th and Ward parkway. There is some damage to the stone structure. Greg suggested replacing it with a retaining wall made of blocks. A resident asked if flowers are planted there. There are rosebushes there. We also discussed having the signs washed. Residents approved replacing the retaining wall and cleaning the signs with a vote.

A resident asked if the statue at the triangle will be replaced. As it was stolen less than one year after it was installed, it is unlikely that it will be replaced. Several residents complimented the roses at the triangle.

Next we discussed 9016 Holly street. The house had a fire. Greg encouraged residents to call the 311 Action Center. This can also be done online. A resident asked about a vacant house in the neighborhood and inquired about whether we can take action against the owner. Because it is in good repair, we cannot take action. A resident who works for the city recommended we directly contact the investigations division.

A resident noted that during any heavy rain, a large puddle accumulates at 91st and Washington. Others replied that it has been serviced recently.

Greg mentioned the bushes at 89th and Holly. They are starting to look ragged and can impede visibility. The residents voted to remove the bushes.

Greg informed residents that invoices for dues will be mailed out and will be due January 1. They will still be \$50. A resident requested that we send information about leaf pickup with these invoices.

Greg opened the floor for comments and concerns:

There is an overgrown bush at 90th terrace and Belleview.

A resident asked if there is a WHHA website or Facebook page. We do have a Facebook page. If we would like to have a web page, it will cost about \$350 to build, and \$60 per year to host. Residents voted to have Area Real Estate administer the WHHA website.

A resident asked about sending newsletters to residents who do not have Internet access. Each mailing costs around \$277.

A question was asked about sending out information about the garage sale weekend. Greg suggested we make the garage sale happen on a regular date. We voted to have the sale on the first weekend of June.

A resident requested a microphone at the next meeting.

Chris Wiley and Paul Snare volunteered to join the Board, these nominations were seconded.

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The meeting was adjourned at 8:05.
